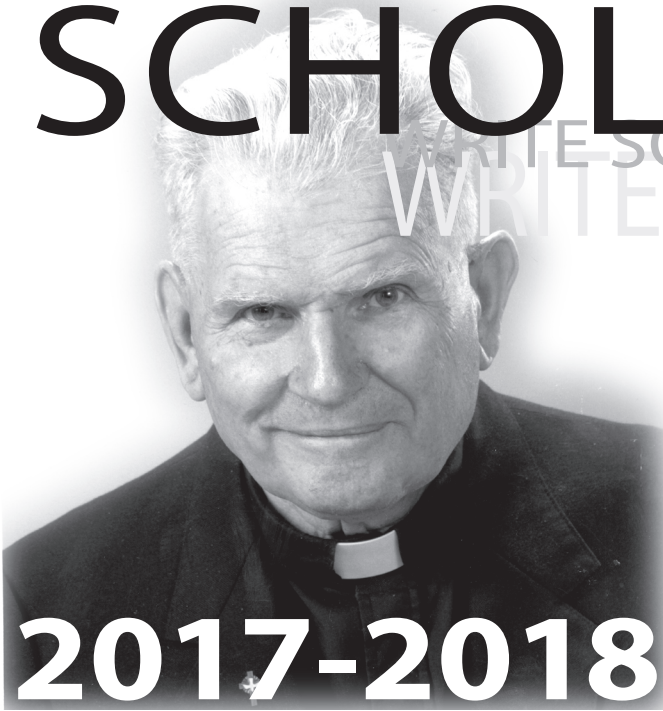


FATHER TED COLLETON SCHOLARSHIP
